RIVER-FRIENDLY CARWASH PROGRAM FACT SHEET FOR RECREATION & PARK DISTRICTS

General Information

Fundraiser carwashes are a valuable source of funding for many groups and organizations. However, the soapy washwater from a carwash (often carrying dirt, grease, and other pollutants) typically flows along a parking lot or other paved surface until it enters the storm drain system. From there, it goes untreated to our creeks and rivers, potentially harming fish and other aquatic life.

All by itself, one fundraiser carwash may not seem to be contributing much pollution to our local waterways; but collectively, fundraiser carwashes can contribute significant amounts of harmful pollutants to our creeks and rivers. Additionally, state and local regulations prohibit discharges of pollutants to the storm drain system.

River-Friendly Carwash Program

Sacramento County's Stormwater Quality Program has developed the River-Friendly Carwash Program to provide guidance to help facilitate successful fundraiser carwashes while protecting local creeks and rivers. We've developed a River-Friendly Carwash website and will be directing fundraising groups to this website for information on how to partner with participating River-Friendly Recreation and Park Districts. By becoming a River-Friendly Park District partner, your park district will have the opportunity to provide suitable fundraising carwash locations at parks to prevent vehicle washwater from entering the storm drain system. Acceptable Park Locations For Fundraiser Carwashes

Sacramento County's Stormwater Quality Program staff can work with you to identify appropriate Best Management Practices (BMPs) and acceptable carwash locations at your parks to prevent vehicle washwater from entering the storm drain system. Below are a few ways to prevent the washwater from entering the storm drain system:

- Discharge the vehicle washwater to soil or landscaped area;
- Re-direct the vehicle washwater to the sanitary sewer;
- Wash vehicles on pervious pavement.
