About this Newsletter

This newsletter provides current information about the D33 El Paraiso Storm Drain Pump Station Rehabilitation Project. If you have additional questions, please contact the project staff listed on the right. A project map is printed on the back of this newsletter for your reference.

Background

The D33 El Paraiso Storm Drain Pump Station is located adjacent to the southeast corner of 5100 El Paraiso Avenue. This station was originally constructed in 1969. The station pumps all storm water from the 574-acre water shed into the concrete lined channel that flows to Morrison Creek. The electrical equipment at the station is outdated and in need of upgrades.

Project Description

This project will upgrade the station's electrical equipment to current industry standards. These upgrades include a new electrical building with new electrical and instrumentation equipment. Additionally, the project will install new automated trash racks eliminating the labor-intensive manual trash rack cleaning and allowing debris removal when the station is unstaffed. These upgrades will significantly improve the station's safety, functionality, and reliability to better provide flood protection to the area.

Project Updates

The Board of Supervisors approved the project on May 24, 2022. The project received three bids on June 30, 2022. On August 23, 2022, the contract was awarded to the lowest responsive responsible bidder – TNT Industrial Contractors, Inc.

The project construction will be split into two phases over two summers.

Quality Assurance

Jose Valenzuela is the construction inspector for the project. He will resolve most issues and ensure the work meets the design specifications. Uttam Ban is the Construction Management Supervisor. He will oversee construction and handle major issues.

Project Schedule

- Phase 1 construction – July - October 2023
- Phase 2 construction – May - October 2024
